## **CLOSE reading strategies**

Reading closely means reading for <u>meaning</u> and <u>understanding</u>. Follow these 8 steps to perform your own close reading.

## To begin, read your passage slowly.

- <u>Task 1: Vocabulary</u> Look up and define any vocabulary you are unfamiliar with. Double check that the definition makes sense in the context of the text.
- <u>Task 2</u>: Language Choice Underline and comment on any language that attracts your attention for any reason. Why do you find it interesting?
- Task 3: Verbs, nouns, adjectives and adverbs. Highlight in different colors any parts of speech that stand out for any reason. Comment on your findings.
- <u>Task 4: Predictions</u> Make a comment about what might happen next. You MUST give a reason *based on the text you read* as to why your prediction makes sense.
- <u>Task 5: Opinions and reflections</u> Comment on what you think of the story/narrators/characters.
- <u>Task 6: Connections</u> Comment on passages that remind you about your own experiences or other books or films. What are the similarities?
- <u>Task 7: Questions</u> Come up with a question about anything you read. List more **open** questions than **closed** questions. Closed questions can be answered simply with a YES or a NO.
- Task 8: Comment on key themes from the novel that are reflected in the passage.
