Direct and Indirect Objects!

Simply stated, a <u>direct object</u> *receives the action of a verb*. Looking at the definition, <u>THE</u> most important part is that a direct object <u>MUST</u> and <u>CAN ONLY</u> follow an <u>ACTION</u> <u>VERB</u>.

- The **<u>quarterback</u>** for our team **<u>threw</u>** the <u>**ball**</u> downfield.
 - \circ quarterback = SS
 - threw = SP
 - ball = DO since it receives the action of the verb "threw."
- Kevin handed the bowl of mashed potatoes to his sister Brittany.
 - Kevin = SS
 - handed = SP
 - bowl = DO since it receives the action of the verb "handed."
- <u>Members</u> of the chess team <u>boarded</u> the <u>bus</u> after school.
 - Members = SS
 - boarded = SP
 - $\circ~$ bus = DO since it receives the action of the verb "boarded."
- <u>Volunteers</u> at the voting precinct <u>counted</u> <u>ballots</u> when the polls closed.
 - Volunteers = SS
 - \circ counted = SP
 - ballots = DO since it receives the action of the verb "counted."
- A gigantic grizzly **<u>bear snatched</u>** a huge, flopping <u>salmon</u> from the stream.
 - bear = SS
 - snatched = SP
 - salmon = DO since it receives the action of the verb "snatched."

An **indirect object** *is to whom or for whom the action of the sentence was done*. If an indirect object appears in a sentence, it has to adhere (stick to) to a few rules:

- 1. It can only appear in a sentence that has an *action verb*.
- 2. It can only appear in a sentence that has a *direct object*.
- 3. It will *always, always, always* be found between AV and the DO.
- 4. It will answer the question "to whom or for whom was the action done?"

- Baker Mayfield handed Nick Chubb the football.
 - Baker Mayfield = SS
 - handed = SP
 - football = DO since it receives the action of the verb "handed."
 - Nick Chubb = IO since he was "for whom" the action was done.
- Shirley sent her grandma a homemade birthday card covered in glitter.
 - Shirley = SS
 - sent = SP
 - card = DO since it receives the action of the verb "handed."
 - grandma = IO since he was "for whom" the action was done.
- <u>Mrs. Davis</u> shot her misbehaving twin boys a dirty look during church today.
 - Mrs. Davis = SS
 - shot = SP
 - look = DO since it receives the action of the verb "handed."
 - boys = IO since he was "for whom" the action was done.
